STUART TOWN FIRE 13th September 1913

Excerpts from the Wellington Times report An enquiry was held concerning the destruction by fire on Saturday evening last of an unoccupied weatherboard and brick shop at Molong Street Stuart Town.

William Walker, a labourer residing at Stuart Town, deposed that about seven in the evening of the 6th instant, he noticed that an unoccupied wooden building, formerly used as a store, was on fire. Directly he noticed it he ran out into the street and called out "fire". Then, in company with Constable Stuart and others, he got in at the entrance of the brick shop, and helped to remove several articles of furniture into the street, and got most of it out.

They were unsure how the fire started. The brick store was formerly occupied by Betar Bros, and wooden one by Spear Bros as a fruit shop. Men removed furniture stored belonging to Mr Chapman, the night officer at the railway station.

It was impossible to save the brick building without a supply of water.

Some boys had been playing in there and they had a fire in the weatherboard building, and had been burning paper and smoking cigarettes. They said that they thought that the fire had burnt out before they left. Mrs Ellen Marning, wife of Ted, and her brother John Lynch owned the property.
