## **COUNCIL TO WELCOME NEW STRATEGIC AND PLANNING SERVICES DIRECTOR**

Wellington Council will welcome a new Strategic and Planning Services director in the coming months after council passed a recommendation to change the management structure of the organisation.

A report tabled at last night's monthly meeting outlined a number of proposed staffing changes to the local government entity including the reallocation of staff and the addition of new positions including a parks and gardens apprentice and asset manager. Wellington Council general manager Michael Tolhurst said one of the biggest changes would be incorporating planning services, economic development, tourism and the Wellington Caves under the one portfolio.

"This change reflects the focus council will be putting on these areas in the coming years and will ensure a more streamlined approach to people looking to move to Wellington, build or start a new business," Mr Tolhurst said.

"The director in this new role will also oversee any grant funding Wellington Council will apply for which will be pivotal in ensuring council can deliver as many projects as possible."

Meanwhile, the report on changes to operating hours at local waste sites was also discussed by councillors with only a minor change being made the proposed recommendation.

"At Mumbil a hessian bag will now be placed at the waste site for the collection of aluminium cans," Mr Tolhurst said.

"These cans will then be collected and donated to Mumbil Public School for fundraising initiatives." Changes to operating hours at some local waste sites will begin from next week, while the alteration in hours at the Euchareena waste site will not occur until September 1.

"A list of the new opening times and when these changes will come into effect can be seen on the council website and will be displayed at waste sites," Mr Tolhurst s

## Panzanella Soup

We've taken the ingredients from this classic Italian salad and reinvented them as a hearty soup.



### **Ingredients**

410g can chopped tomatoes  
1 green capsicum, seeded, chopped  
1/2 telegraph cucumber, peeled, seeded, chopped  
1 small red onion, chopped, plus extra slices to garnish  
1 garlic clove, crushed  
1 tbs red wine vinegar  
1 tbs extra virgin olive oil  
200ml tomato juice  
6 black olives, pitted, sliced  
1 tbs salted capers, rinsed  
2 tbs small basil leaves  
Toasted croutons, to serve

### Method

Place the tomatoes, capsicum, cucumber, onion, garlic, vinegar, olive oil and tomato juice in a blender, and process to combine.

Add enough water to make a thickish soup consistency, then season with salt and pepper. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Toss together the olives, capers, basil leaves and croutons, and serve on top of the soup.
