Report from STAA Meeting 24th October

The main item of business at the meeting was the Transfer of Title. This is a very important issue for our community as it involves transferring the title of the hall back to Crown.

There are arguments for and against this proposal and committee members are gathering as much information as possible.

Report from Council Community Report Meeting 30th October

Approximately 20 residents and many Councillors and administrative staff attended the meeting on Tuesday evening.



Rod Burgh, the mayor, introduced himself and stated that he thought that these community meetings were an excellent way of engaging with the community and that the "report card" program was a good way for residents to see how goals were being achieved. He did state that there would be financial constraints. He thanked everyone for coming and supporting the council. Michael Tolhurst reviewed the progress of issues planned for the financial year. The red, yellow and green dots on the flow chart indicate whether planned projects have been completed, started on not yet achieved. He stressed that this was an important means of keeping communication going.

There are plans for a bus stop at Euchareena, hopefully to be ready for the start of the new school year.

Another meeting will be held with interested parties as to the future of the old garage in late November.

Ray Pulbrook explained to the meeting that some flood mitigation work had been done on the contours which will hopefully relieve the problems that have been experienced during very heavy rain periods.

The meeting then moved to an open forum and then those in attendance had an opportunity to study the Report card and seek information from the councillors and staff in attendance.

The Report Card will be on display in the RTC noticeboard and one at the Post Office.
